

A religion which followed Jesus Christ


We know it was in Ireland in 431AD as the pope sent a bishop called Palladuis to Ireland

St Patrick is believed to have brought christianity to Ireland




Monasteries

Monasteries are places where Christians went to pray to god without distraction. Many were in remote places. The men in monasteries are called monks.











Scelig Mhichil

Scelig Mhichil is a tiny island off the coast of Kerry which had a monastery on it.




Manuscripts


Manuscripts were books copied by hand. Printing was not yet invented. In monastries the monks copied the bible.

The paper they used was called vellum which is made from the skin of calves







Prain


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An abbot was the head of the monastery
