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- 1. The women's rights movement spread to Ireland in 1960's and women began to demand greater equality. The Employment Equality Agency was set up 1977 and ensures there is no discrimination against women in work and pay.
- 2. Large numbers of women go on to 3rd level education from the 1970's onwards.
- 3. The marriage ban was lifted and women no longer have to give up their jobs in civil service when they marry.
- 4. Women have become more involved in politics. There was the first woman leader of an Irish political party and President in the 1990's and recently the first Tánaiste.
- 5. Women have become more prominent in the world of sport. (Katy Taylor and Sonia O Sullivan)
- 6. There is better access to contraception and family planning; it has become more acceptable for women to work outside the home.

- 1. Health and Safety has become increasingly important with many laws passed to ensure people work in a safe environment
- 2. Better pay and working conditions due to work of Unions. There is equality of pay and access to employment
- 3. Change from primary activities such as farming to manufacturing and services. As a result there are purpose built industrial estates and huge factory plants such as Wyeth and Intel. With increased education there are highly skilled jobs available.

- Suburbs of Dublin have grown rapidly e.g. Tallaght over 100,000 people and the boundaries of Dublin are increasing. Large number of people moved to city from countryside since 1960's - new jobs
- 2. Still have problems in inner-city areas esp. unemployment. Also a growing problem of crime and drug abuse in many cities. There is a lack of amenities in some areas esp. for young. Also a growing problem of waste disposal as cities grow. Transport congestion
- 3. Many large new shopping centres and cinemas built. 1st shopping centre opened 1967 in Stillorgan. Dundrum, Liffey Valley are large shopping and leisure areas
- 4. Urban renewal schemes very important in late 1980's e.g. Temple Bar. As space becomes less available there has been a huge increase in number of apartments built.

#### Rural life

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- Rural isolation as many leave the farms for work in the cities leaving behind older relatives. This leads to a loss of a sense of community and the decline in many rural and cultural traditions.
- 2. Improvement in machinery and labour saving devices means unemployment for farm labourers but more spare time for farmers.
- 3. Towns become depopulated leading to closure of shops, pubs and business's
- 4. Chain stores and supermarkets replace local shops
- Membership of the EU brought greater prosperity to rural areas and modernisation of homes (1973). CAP gave better prices for crops and later quotas had to be introduced to stop overproduction

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- 1. Cars have become more affordable and many households have more than one car.
- 2. Many new smaller airports built in recent years such as Knock and air travel has become cheaper with the introduction of low cost air lines. (Ryanair 85)
- 3. Many new and improved roads built such as the M50. They bypass towns in an effort to improve traffic congestion. Travel times have been shortened for example the new M6 road connects Galway to Dublin in 2 hours
- 4. Luas and Dart try to improve travel times for commuters in Dublin as do new and improved Quality Bus Corridors.
