
Leonardo Da Vinci

 He learned how to paint and to make brushes.


 It is said that when his master seen how good Leonardo was he never painted again and became a sculptor.

 Cut up dead bodies to see the muscles and bones






Mona Lisa

- Soon, after he was finished it began to peel away




Notebooks


- Leonardo always carried a notebook with him.
- He drew interesting faces. If he seen someone with an interesting face he would follow them home to finish the drawing.
- He drew sketches of animals, insects and of nature







- He used mirror writing
- Today there are over 5000 pages of his notebooks
- They have diagrams of his inventions and notes on several other topics.
- In fact Leonardo used to get bored easily so there are very few of his paintings finished.




Inventor

 He designed a lot of weapons of war for the Duke of Milan who was fighting a war.

Later Life

- He had to leave Milan due to a war
- The king of France invited him to France and he died there three years later.
- He died in 1519.
- He is at rest in a chapel in the grounds of Amboise Chateau in France.
